Description	Physiological and biochemical features of nutrient needs. The roles of nutrients in the development and adaptability of the whole body, organs and cells. Interpretation of current research data.  Note: This is a combined 4 <sup>th</sup> year undergraduate course (NFS484) and graduate level course (NFS1484). All students attend the same class, but assignments for undergraduate and graduate students differ.
