<b>Course Number, Title &amp; Description</b>	<b>NFS486H1S Obesity: Metabolic and Clinical Aspects</b> Obesity and its co-morbidities illustrated with pathophysiological and biochemical principles and clinical case studies. Discussions of public health policy are also included. This course is characterized by active learning in the classroom; students work in small groups to interpret scientific data and solve problems related to the lecture content. Course materials from the previous instructor will be available.
