Course Number, Title &	NFS400H1S Functional Foods & Nutraceuticals
Description	This course describes the regulation, health benefits, and marketing of functional foods and nutraceuticals. The instructor lectures for the first four weeks of term only. The course is intended to be one in which students do most of the teaching. Students work in groups of 5 -6 to prepare a 1-hour presentation on a functional food. The instructor will spend the middle 3 weeks of term meeting with groups, to advise then on how to best present their scientific information. Student presentations are scheduled in the final five weeks of term. Materials from the previous instructor will be available to assist the instructor.
